# **Philosophy of Chest Heart & Stroke Training**

Chest Heart & Stroke Scotland aim to provide a learning environment where members of the Multi-Disciplinary team, from Health and Social Care sectors, may learn from both the content of the course and from one another.

We feel that the sharing of knowledge and experience can allow people to make changes to their practice which in turn may enhance the care they give to their patient/client. To enable us to do this we will undertake evaluation of the course content and delivery, and feedback any relevant comments to the individual trainer or organisation concerned. # **Current Care in Stroke - Part I**



#### **Target Group:**

Health and social care staff who work with people affected by stroke and their carers.

#### **Course Aim:**

To develop the core knowledge of health and social care staff and facilitate further development of their skills and confidence when working with people affected by stroke and their families. This course is aligned to the Stroke Core Competencies for Healthcare Staff, developed by NHS Education Scotland (NES 2005). The course content and delivery has been endorsed by NES.

#### **Outcomes:**

Each individual session has a specific aim and learning outcomes which are aligned to the Stroke Core Competencies. By the end of the course participants will have enhanced their knowledge and skills related to stroke care and be able to identify areas for further personal learning and development.

## **Current Care in Stroke - Part 2**

#### **Target Group:**

Health and social care staff who have completed Current Care in Stroke – Part I and wish to further develop their knowledge and skills related to stroke care.

#### **Course Aim:**

To further develop core knowledge and skills in relation to caring for someone who has had a stroke and their carers.

#### **Outcomes:**

Each session has a specific aim and learning outcomes. By the end of the course participants will have reflected on their knowledge and skills related to stroke care and have identified areas for further personal learning and development. Participants will be able to identify areas of their own practice where improvements/changes may be beneficial to their clients/patients.

# Single Stroke Study Day

These study days are based on specific topics related to stroke. They are offered to health and social care staff working with people affected by stroke. These study days are based around current topics related to stroke care and will be advertised approximately six weeks before. All health professionals at any level are eligible to apply for topic specific study days.

# **Social Services Study Day**

These courses have been developed to meet the needs of Social Services staff. Topics covered are current and evidence based, they include What is a Stroke? and practical issues and ways to help. For further information regarding these days contact the Stroke Education Facilitator.

# **STAT (Stroke & TIA Assessment Training)**

STAT has been developed for registered nurses or junior medical staff working in A&E, Acute Medical Admissions Units, Medical High Dependency Units or Stroke Units who may be involved in the assessment of patients with a new stroke or TIA.

It comprises of a mix of classroom based teaching and interactive scenarios designed to improve the recognition and management of acute stroke and TIA, including thrombolysis and its complications. A short test (multiple choice questions) must be successfully completed to receive your certificate. For more information on STAT please contact the Stroke Education Facilitator.
