Graham was just 51 when he had a stroke, which turned out to be lifesaving – further tests revealed he needed an immediate heart operation to fit a pacemaker.

The stroke left Graham with aphasia, a communication disorder that meant he had to learn to read and write all over again. He did that with the help and support of a Chest Heart & Stroke Scotland online peer support group and one-to-one sessions with a volunteer who helped him weekly with his language skills.



Graham is now back at work on a phased return, crediting the support from CHSS in his ongoing recovery. He says: "It was the emotional support from CHSS that really helped at first. I'm too young to retire, I have to keep working.

"Sam, the volunteer, really helped me rebuild my communication skills and gave me the confidence to go back into the office. The support really made all the difference to me."

Our Kindness Caller Sadaf is helping connect Chest Heart & Stroke Scotland to the south-east Asian community in Scotland, delivering support calls to service users in Punjabi or Urdu.



Mum-of-three Sadaf, 41, says her role is vital in ensuring those for whom English is a second language don't feel isolated or afraid.

She says: "Many older people in the Asian community perhaps came to the UK without speaking English and never picked it up because they didn't need to.

"Knowing they can get a call from someone who not only speaks their language but also comes from a similar background is a really helpful thing for this community.

"I call a lady every Tuesday for a chat. I feel very privileged that she trusts me enough to share things with me. It's a lovely position to be in. Being able to volunteer and help people from your community who just need to talk to someone, that's priceless. I am reconnecting her to her roots but I'm reconnecting myself too."
